 his wife of the first part, John R. Chambliss and Richard H. Baskin Jr. Trustees of the second
 part and the creditors of the said E. F. Munfee hereinafter named of the third part, Whereas the said
 Edward F. Munfee is justly indebted to the following persons and in the following amounts
 to wit: to W^m H. Belov seven hundred dollars due by bond bearing date with 23rd June
 1856 and two hundred dollars or thereabouts due by open account to W^m H. Belov for
 \$102.00 with interest from the 15th Oct. 1849, to W^m A. Maspenburg \$17.00 interest
 costs due by judgment; To W^m A. Maspenburg \$30.00 interest & costs due by judg-
 ment to R. H. Baskin Jr. \$30.00 due by bond with interest from the 1st Oct. 1856, to
