To have and to hold the said hereby granted tract or parcel of land hereby conveyed unto the said Patrick Rose his heirs & assigns forever and the said William Drake for himself & his heirs hereby covenant and promise to and with the said Patrick Rose trustee his heirs & assigns to pay to the said William Drake in manner and form following that is to say: that the said William Drake his heirs & assigns shall and will so soon after the happening of such default of payment sell to the highest bidder for ready money at public auction after paying the time and place of sale at his own discretion and giving thirty days notice thereof at the Committee doors of the County of Southampton on some Court day previous to the day of sale sell to the highest bidder for ready money so arising from such sale shall satisfy the charges thereon and all other expenses attending the same pay to the said Zachariah Doyal or his legal representative the above mentioned sum of three hundred dollars and the legal interest thereon, the balance if any pay to the said William Drake or his legal representative. But if the above sum shall be paid off so that no default be made in the payment thereof, then this indenture to ~~said~~ is also to remain in full force and virtue.
