Bryant, trustee the following property, to wit, his bedstead, bed and furniture one horn and gear one spinning wheel, 1 pair Cards, two Tables, one gun, one chest, 1/2 doz chairs, one pot one spindle, 1 frying pan, one skillet, one saddle, 1 set knives & forks thirteen plates, three dishes one st. cups and saucers one pair two coffee pots, one sugar stand, two Bales one milk pot one iron pot, one crop saw two axes, one frow, one wedge, three trays, three tubs, one saddle & Reids one Cart and wheels and gear two ploughs, three plough hoes, three weed hoes, two grub hoes, two sticks fodder two Bble head, Tent two pens, four hundred lbs bacon, one white horse fifteen hays, one steer, and the present crop. In trust to secure Catharine O. Bryant five notes of thirty dollars each the first due the 25 day of Dec^r 1856, the other due each year following, R. A. Bryant one bond for one hundred dollars due the 6 day of May 1857, Charles J. Taylor one note of thirty five dollars thirty etc. J. J. This Deed made, this 15th day of May 1857, between Thomas M. Bailey the grantor of the one part and Joseph S. M. Summrell trustee of the other part (White full); that the said Thomas M. Bailey doth grant unto the said Joseph S. M. Summrell the following property, to wit, his interest in a certain deed of trust executed by him to Julian J. Branch as trustee for the benefit of Alexander Fairweather on the 16th of May 1856 and executed in the Clerk's office of Suchampton, containing one hundred and seventy five acres of land and two slaves to wit Videll and Mont Bob all of which will more fully appear by reference to the said deed, the said T. M. Bailey hereby conveying all his interest in the said deed after payment of the debts thereby secured, also one horse, buggy, and Pennsylvania stock of cattle hogs and sheep all his growing crops of every description, household and kitchen furniture and farming implements and two old slaves Billy and Mimmy To have and to hold to him the said Joseph S. M. Summrell and his heirs forever. In trust to secure a bond for the sum of \$1880 25 etc due to Elliot D. Bailey, Thomas M. Bailey, Mary A. Bailey, James S. A. Bailey, Joseph M. Bailey, Olyo C. Bailey and Innocent M. Bailey and it is hereby agreed and covenanted that the said Thomas M. Bailey is to be permitted to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said property for the term of five years he paying annually to the beneficiaries parties abovesaid the interest on the bond due them, but upon the failure of the said Thomas M. Bailey to pay the interest due at the end of any year before the expiration of the said five years, or at the end of five years from the date of this bond with failure of the said T. M. Bailey to have paid the same then on the happening of either event a joint request made by either of the beneficiaries abovesaid named in the said trust, the said Joseph S. M. Summrell shall after giving at least twenty days notice of the time and place of sale by public advertisement at several places in the County proceed to sell at public auction on the premises to the highest bidder the abovesaid property
