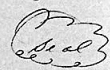


This Deed made this 23^d day of April A.D. One thousand eight hundred and fifty seven between Brown S. Lykes grantor of the one part and John Lykes grantor of the other part, Witnesseth; that the said grantor for the consideration of the sum of fifteen hundred dollars to him lawfully paid by the said grantor the receipt of which sum is hereby acknowledged have sold and do hereby grant and convey unto the said grantor and to his heirs forever in fee simple all of that tract and parcel of land lying within of Southampton and known as the Harris Whitehead place containing four hundred and sixty one acres more or less and bounded as follows viz: on the north by the lands of Elizabeth Porter and Thos Sewell on the east by the lands of Edwin Harris on the south by the lands of Nathl. S. Francis and John A. Weston and on the west by the lands of Nathl. S. Francis and Thomas Sewell, it being the same tract of land that formerly belonged to Harris Whitehead. And the said Brown S. Lykes grantor warrants generally the title to the property hereby conveyed. Witness the following signature and seal.

This Indenture, made and entered into on the 1st day of January in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty seven, between Catharine E. Breyant of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Richard L. Breyant of the same County and State of the other part, Witnesseth; that the said Catharine E. Breyant for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars to her hands paid by the said Richard L. Breyant at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. Hath granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto him the said Richard L. Breyant his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land situated, lying, and being within the aforesaid County of Southampton and parish of Saint Luke's containing by estimation sixty six and two thirds Acres to the same more or less and bounded by the lands of Thomas Corbett, Capt James Majett and by the down land of Mrs. Lydia Breyant: To have and to hold the above described tract or parcel of land and premises with all and singular rights appertaining thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining unto him the said Richard L. Breyant his heirs and assigns forever, to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Richard L. Breyant his heirs and assigns forever; And the said Catharine E. Breyant for herself, her heirs, Executors and Administrators doth hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Richard L. Breyant his heirs, Executors, Administrators, and assigns, that she will by these presents warrant and forever defend all and singular title of the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises and every part or parcel thereof against the claims or demands of all and every other person or persons whatsoever.
