

This said Deed was wholly proved up to the said Jos. W. Edwards and Joshua W. Edwards by the  
said R. S. Jones also a subscribing witness thereto was therupon committed to record

This deed made the eighteenth day of May A.D. One thousand eight hundred and fifty seven, between the said Mr. Jones of the County of Hanover in the State of Virginia of the one part and Jacob Brown of the County of Southampton of the other part. Whereas by virtue of a decree of the Circuit Court held for Southampton County at the November Term 1855 in which it was decreed (and ordered that Wm M. Jones & Ernest H. Bls., after giving twenty days notice of the time & place of sale shall expose to public sale upon a court of stellar marks (except a sum sufficient to pay the costs of the suit (and expenses of the sale) the tract of land in the bill mentioned, whereof Abraham L. Gardner did seize of possession thereof in pursuance of said decree. Whereas Wm M. Jones as Commissioner aforesaid did on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of December 1855, on the premises before to public sale the said tract of land (the time and place of sale having been as aforesaid thirty days previous thereto) when the said Jacob Brown became the last bidder (and purchased for the sum of Three thousand dollars). This indenture therefore further witnesseth that for (and in consideration of) Three thousand dollars (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) to the said Wm M. Jones as Commissioner aforesaid hath bargained (and sold) the said tract of land to the said Jacob Brown. Likewise (and aforesaid) the tract of land whereof Abraham L. Gardner did seize of possession thereof said to contain two hundred and sixteen and a half acres more or less reserving however one eighth of an acre in all at including the corner or boundary ground, which was sold with the residue as aforesaid at public sale as aforesaid. To have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereto belonging (except as before reserved unto the said Jacob Brown his heirs and assigns) shall well and do warrant and defend by virtue of the decree aforesaid (and no further). In trust to become (and indemnify) Edward C. Compton & Nelson B. Gardner at his the said Brown's securities to two bonds one executed to Richard Bennett guardian for £1000, dated January 1<sup>st</sup> 1857 for seven hundred and sixty dollars (and the other
