 dec'd both real and personal, in trust to secure the true and faithful payment to J. S.  
 D. Bland of a negotiable note for two hundred and fifty dollars payable at the  
 Office of Discount and deposit of the Bank of Virginia in Portsmouth dated  
 the 1<sup>st</sup> day of August 1857, at sixty days after date and all interest which may  
 become due and payable on said note.

 Edwards and Edith his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred  
 and twenty five dollars paid by the said Rich H. Bishop at and before the date  
 granted, bargained and sold and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto  
 the said Rich H. Bishop his Heirs and assigns forever one certain tract of
