Babb with good grantees, bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell unto the said Jno. M. Guley his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit: Two Houses (34) Thirtysix head of hogs, one work ox, 1 cow, one calf, A cart of wheels, Kitchen Stodd & Kitchen furniture of every description his present growing crop, corn, fodder, pease and potatoes together with all other articles of personal property belonging to the said Jno. W. Babb to have and to hold the said property hereby conveyed unto the said Jno. W. Guley his heirs and assigns forever, until default be made the payment of the whole of the above mentioned bonds and interest. And then upon the failure to be required advertising and selling the highest bidder at public auction to much of the above mentioned property as will be sufficient to satisfy the above mentioned debt, interest & cost attending the carrying into effect these premises
