This deed made this first day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven, between Edward Beaton (Grantor) of the first part William M. Beaton (Trustee) of the second part and parties hereafter mentioned of the third part, witness that the said Edward Beaton (Grantor) as aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to the said grantor paid by the said Trustee, the receipt of which sum is hereby acknowledged and for and in consideration of other purposes hereafter mentioned, doth hereby convey and grant to the said Trustee the following property, to-wit: one tract of land known as the Boynton's Deft tract containing about six hundred acres and bounded by Sarasas Creek, by the lands of Allen Joyner, Lucy M. Kindred, Benja B. Kindred, and James Barnes, the tract of land known as the Myrick & Bryant farm that is to say all the being of land owned by me there containing about five hundred and fifty acres more or less, it being the same body of land which is made up by the Myrick farm the Bryant farm and the Vick farm, the same being bounded North by Lucy M. Kindred's land, East by Jacob Barnes's and Miles W. Wells's South by Lewis Vick and West by Lewis Vick and Lucy Kindred. The same tract of land known as the Dimmy Grove containing fifty four acres more or less bounded by the lands of Jacob Barnes, Lewis Vick, Jonathan Dandred and others. The entire stock and mules of horses of the said Beaton say two or twelve head, his entire stock of cattle say fifty head more or less, entire stock of hogs, sheep &c. his crops of all kinds now gathered or growing in the said three farms, before mentioned, corn, cotton, peas, oats &c. also the following negro slaves, to-wit: Hartwell, Elias, Barbary, Mandy, Cherry, and two children, Walter and Millian and negro woman Denny. Now hold and kitchen furniture of all kinds now belonging to the said Beaton found in the County of Southampton, also all his farming utensils of every kind, Waggons, carts, plows, &c. pleases carriages, of every kind whatsoever, huggers, jiggs &c. In trust to secure the payment of the following debts, that is to say first pay to Henry Kindred's Executors whatever may be due on about 1842, or then to the said Henry Kindred in the month December A.D. 1842, or then about five hundred and eight dollars (\$508.00) upon which there are several credits - and secondly pay to Benjamin B. Kindred one bond for twelve hundred dollars (\$1200.00 cents) on demand sixty days after date and dated April 13th 1857. an other bond for nine hundred and fifty five dollars and eighty three cents (\$945.83 cents) due and dated February 1857, one other bond for one hundred and eight and twelve cents (\$118.12 cents) due and dated April 13th 1857. One bond due to Lucy M. Kindred for one hundred and twenty nine dollars and sixty five cents (\$171.65 cents) due and dated January 1st 1857. an other bond due the same for one hundred and twenty dollars due and dated February 11th 1857. and one other bond executed to the same by Beaton & Harrison for fifty two dollars and sixteen cents due January 7th 1855, and dated Jan. 14th 1855. And further pay to James R. Joyner, three bonds, making the aggregate
