

This deed made the 16th day of September in the year 1857 between Collin J. Ferguson the grantor of the one part and Perry R. Hinde the trustee of the other part, witnesseth, that the said Collin J. Ferguson the grantor doth and do grant unto the said Perry R. Hinde the trustee that following property; My entire crop of corn, peas, fodder, & cotton, one growing two sows and fourteen sheats one cow two feather beds, six chairs and all my household and kitchen furniture, two free born negroes and two trace plows, two axes, & one shot gun. In trust to secure the debts of W^m. Beaton one note of forty nine dollars & 11⁰⁰/₁₀₀ due 1st day of January 1857, one store account of fifteen dollars & 75⁰⁰/₁₀₀, one note of nine dollars due 25th day of December 1857 and one store account in favour of W^m. Beaton & John W. Harrison of thirty one dollars & 81⁰⁰/₁₀₀ and one account in favour of Joseph R. Mose of six dollars and one account in favour of Raphael & Stephenson of twenty five dollars. And the said grantor warrants generally the title of the property hereby conveyed. Witness our hands and seal this 16th day of September 1857

This deed made the 15th day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven, between Zachariah Hicks (free negro) of the one part and George Moore of the other part; Witnesseth; That the said Zachariah Hicks, for, doth grant unto the said George Moore the following property; all his present crop of corn, fodder, peas and beans, one feather bed & furniture, one pine table, one safe, one window and seven split bottom chairs, ten plates, three dishes, six cups, six saucers, six table spoons and six tea spoons, eight knives, eight forks, & pine chests, & black tubs, one water bucket, one bread tray, & spiders, one corn, two pots, & washing bowl, 1 pair of Andirons, 1 axe, one flour stand and one spinning, & pair boards and one sifter. In trust to secure the payment of the following debts one bond held by Orris Moore for Forty Dollars, one acct due the same for eight dollars and one acct held by the same for five dollars. One acct due Jas. D. Bryant for Eight Dollars and one note due E. L. Fry as admr. of Jas. F. Laskin's de & for four Dollars and thirteen cents with Int. from Apr. 7th 1857.
