Story and Eliza his wife for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred and twenty five Dollars to them in hand paid by the said Parker D. Story at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted, bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto him the said Parker D. Story his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land situated lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and parish of Saint Lukes containing by Survey one hundred and thirty and half acres be the same more or less, it being the tract of land which the said Thomas M. Story purchased of Williams Darden and known as part of the Gentry tract of Land and bounded by the lands of the said S. D. Story, Nathl. A. Bishop and Benjamin E. Daughtry To have and to hold the above described tract or parcel of Land and premises with the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining unto him the said Parker D. Story his heirs and assigns forever, to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Parker D. Story his heirs and assigns forever and the said Thomas M. Story and Eliza his wife for themselves their heirs Executors Administrators do hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Parker D. Story his heirs, Executors Administrators and assigns that will by these presents warrant and forever defend all the right and title of the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land and premises and every part or parcel thereof against the claims or demands of all and every other person or persons whatsoever.
