Gayley is bound as his security to whomsoever due and secondly all other debts due from the said Henry Blow; all of said last mentioned debts to be placed in and in equality, but to be postponed until the first named debts for which said John M. This Deed made this 27th day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven, between Henry Blow (grantor) of the first part, No. 1 Hundred, Trustee, of the second part and Samuel Kello of the third part; Witnesseth, that the said grantor for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him paid by the said trustee, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged and for the further consideration of having the said Kello harmless and free from all loss as security for the said Blow as herein after specified, doth grant and convey unto the said trustee all that tract or parcel of land in which the said grantor now resides containing three hundred and eighty five acres more or less (385 acres) and bounded north by the lands of Thomas Ridley, East by the Halloway river, South by those of Ascher Vick, Osborne Vick and John M. Gayley and West by those of Seth M. Bishop. Intend to secure and save harmless from all loss or damage the said Samuel Kello as security for the said Blow to the following Fortcoming or Delivering Bonds - that is to say, three executed to Mary Ketchum one in the penalty of nine hundred dollars and two others in the penalty of Two hundred dollars each dated July 1st 1857, two executed to W^m J. Sapp's wife Susan, one in the penalty of Four hundred dollars and the other in the penalty of three hundred dollars of the same date as the last aforesaid one executed to W^m J. Sapp in the penalty of Three hundred and ninety dollars of the same date - One executed to W^m A. Mafford in the penalty of Two hundred dollars of the same date and one executed to Richard Dwyer, the suit on which was brought in the County Court and the exact amount due on which debt is not remembered say two hundred dollars more or less.
