Kelle and Thos. J. Dretler free from any harm or act of either of their securityships or debts which I owe them, I do hereby make over and assign to the said John J. Kinners as trustee the following tract or parcel of land lying in Southampton County, Situate on a narrow River and called Mill Swamp and known as the old place. Now the said John J. Kinners when required to do so by either of the above mentioned parties shall sell up & sell the aforesaid tract of Land & out of the proceeds of the sale of the said Land first save the s^d Samuel Kelle harmless from all his securityships; Secondly Davis Barrett; and lastly Samuel B.
