

This deed made the 21<sup>st</sup> day of December 1857 between Pierce Turner of the first part and  
Larkfield of the other part, witnesseth that the said Pierce Turner in consideration of one hundred  
and forty dollars of lawful money of this Commonwealth to him in hand paid by the said David  
Larkfield at or before the insuring and delivery of these presents to the receipt whereof it is hereby  
acknowledged, have bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said  
David Larkfield his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being  
in the County of Southampton containing twenty acres to the same more or less Belonging  
to the tract of land Pierce Turner, Plaintiff of Plaintiff & Rose, defendant by the  
affidavit of Plaintiff Turner, Sarah E. Rose, Amos Joyce, and Dr. J. Cobb, Doctor  
and he holds the said tract or parcel of land with the tenements therein Belonging unto the  
Pierce Turner his heirs and assigns the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances  
unto the said Larkfield his heirs and assigns free from the claims or claims of others  
Pierce Turner or his heirs and all and every person or persons whatsoever shall not  
and do warrant and forever defend by these presents. In witness whereof the said  
Pierce Turner have, hereunto set his hand and seal the day and year first above  
written.

and fifty seven, Sarah E. Bennett widow of R. G. Bennett deceased of the first part & John  
R. Rockelle trustee of the second part and David Bennett of the third part all of the County of  
Southampton State of Virginia whereas the said Sarah E. Bennett is justly indebted by her  
to the said David Bennett to the sum of Eight hundred and four dollars principal with interest  
thereon as follows: Eleven notes of Twenty three dollars and eighteen cents each having  
date the 24<sup>th</sup> day of January 1857 for the amount of her pecuniary of the sale of negroes  
belonging to the estate of R. G. Bennett deceased, sold under a decree of the Court which with  
the legal interest that may accrue thereon the said Sarah E. Bennett with  
and descent to her. Now this indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the  
sum of one dollar lawful money of Virginia to the said Sarah E. Bennett in hand  
paid by the said John R. Rockelle (trustee) at and before the sealing and delivering  
these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said David  
E. Bennett, both given, granted, bargained, sold, alienated, infested, released, con-  
firmed and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, infest, release and  
convey to the said J. R. Rockelle his heirs and assigns forever the following  
land, namely Martha, Jane, Eddie, Henry and their wives and their  
ancestors to hold the said hereby granted or intended to be hereby granted  
Martha, Jane, Eddie, Henry and their wives and their  
ancestors to hold the said hereby granted or intended to be hereby granted  
unto the said John R. Rockelle his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever, and the  
said Sarah E. Bennett for herself her heirs, executors, administrators and assigns doth hereby covenant  
promise and agree to and with the said John R. Rockelle his heirs, executors, administrators and  
affidavit names negroes hereby conveyed against the claims or demands of all and every
