

This deed made this 28th day of October 1857 between Benjamin O'Donnelly of the one part and Andrew J. Kello of the other part, wife Mary Jane of the one part and Andrew J. Kello of the other part, which appears by reference to a judgment granted the 3rd day of Oct. 1857 by J. H. Hollings by J. Linn a justice of the peace dated the 3rd day of Oct. 1857 and to Samuel Kello in the sum of thirty one Dollars & Eighty four cts by bearing date with these presents. Now the said Benjamin O'Donnelly being desirous to secure the aforesaid debt do grant, bargain and sell upon trust to the said Andrew J. Kello for the benefit of the said Patrick H. Hollings and Samuel Kello, one tract or parcel of land situate in the County of Southampton containing 47 acres, one feather bed and furniture 1 Double Brand Gun, one Saw & pigs. Now if the said Benjamin O'Donnelly shall pay to the said Patrick H. Hollings & Samuel Kello their respective debts as mentioned above & Int. accruing thereon as also all costs attending this deed to have the same may be demanded then this deed to be void but if he should fail to pay when demanded then the said Andrew J.
