This Deed made this second day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty
eight between William M. Beaton of the first part and A. I. Williams of the other
part both of the County of Southampton, W. Va.; that whereas Edward Beaton
of the said County, did, by deed of trust recorded in the Clerk's Office of the Circuit
Court of said County on the second (3rd) day of September, A.D. 1857, consigned and granted
to the said William M. Beaton as trustee for the benefit of certain summitters and creditors
therein specified together with other property real and personal a certain tract or
parcel of land before this time held and owned by the said Edward Beaton and known
as the "Piney Grove" and more fully hereinafter described: - And whereas the said A. I. Williams
having been induced so to do by the beneficiaries in the aforesaid deed of
trust named did sell at public auction, for cash, on the fourteenth day of
January, A.D. 1858, the said tract or parcel of land unto the said A. I. Williams
became the purchaser. Now this deed witnesseth, that the said William M.
Beaton for and in consideration of the summes and further considerations of one
thousand and five dollars to him paid by the said Williams the receipt whereof he
sum is hereby acknowledged doth grant and convey to the said A. I. Williams
all that tract or parcel of land in the said deed of trust described lying in
said County known as the Piney Grove supposed to contain forty three acres
more or less and bounded on the North by the lands belonging to the heirs of George
Whitfield, East by the lands belonging to the estate of Jacob Barnes dec'd
South by the same - and west by the lands belonging to Lewis Wickmire Jonathan
Dudley, the latter being the same which is held by his wife as dower out of the
estate of Lewis Wendell Senior deceased.

And the said A. I. M. Beaton grants and conveys to the said A. I. Williams, all the
right, title and interest in him until as trustee as aforesaid and no more supposed to
be after simple interest.
