This Deed made this Sixth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty Eight, between Lawson Beal of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia of the one part, and N. R. Jaynes, Trustee, of the other part, of the same County and State. Wethersfield, the said Lawson Beal doth grant unto the said N. R. Jaynes the following property, Testi; Three yoke of Oxen, two carts and chains, two cows and calves, nine head of Hogs, about ten barrels of corn, one thousand pounds of Salt pork, one thousand pounds of fodder, one Key of Land, farming implements and all my Household and Kitchen furniture, one shot gun and all other property that I have that is not above named. The above property is all in trust to secure my creditors hereinafter named except what the Law will allow me. First to secure Augustus Smith of the same County and State, two bonds amounting to about two hundred dollars (Second) to secure Charles Beal as Surety on a bond payable to Frank Davis, Executor of Howell Davis dec'd. for the sum of one hundred and twenty two (Third) to secure B. C. Walker in a note of twenty orthety Dollars (Fourth) to secure all my creditors not above named equally. And it is covenanted and agreed between the parties aforesaid that in case of a sale the same shall be made after first advertising the time, place and terms, whereof forty-five days the sum is to be cash.
