This Deed made the twentieth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight, between Herman L. Brantley of the County of Greenville in the State of Virginia of the one part and Walter Draughon of Fayetteville in the State of North Carolina of the other part, witnesseth that the said Herman L. Brantley doth grant unto the said Walter Draughon the following tracts of land with their improvements, buildings, Mill, Mill fixtures, gear, & appurtenances and hereditaments to the said tracts of land belonging and appertaining; one of the said tracts of land is situated in the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia, on the north side of Meherim River adjoining the lands of Peter Edwards, John Whitehead and Mark S. Peets and is one of the tracts of land conveyed to the said Herman L. Brantley by deed executed by James Johnson, Wm. H. C. Merritt, and E. M. Merritt, his wife, and others dated the day of January 1857 (first of the said year) and eight acres conveyed by the said Herman L. Brantley to John Whitehead by deed of record in the Clerk's Office of the said County of Southampton) containing from fourteen to sixteen hundred acres; also all that certain tract of land lying on the east side of Meherim River adjoining the before mentioned tract, situated in the Counties of Greenville in the State of Virginia, and Northampton in the State of North Carolina called the "Delonch tract" adjoining the lands of Green Stanail and Joseph M. S. Rogers, containing four hundred and eight acres more or less being also one of the tracts of land conveyed to the said Herman L. Brantley by deed from James Johnson and others before mentioned, also all that certain tract of land commencing in the south branch of Meherim River at the south east angle of Greenville County, Virginia, and at the point where the boundary line between the States of Virginia and North Carolina crosses said River, thence following the said boundary line between the States aforesaid due west to its intersection with the south boundary of the lands belonging to the Seaboard and Roanoke Rail Road Company, thence crossing at right angles from the south boundary line of the said Rail Road Company one hundred feet to the North Boundary of the said Rail Road Company's land thence following westward along said northern boundary of said Rail Road Company's land a line of fifty feet from the center line of the said Rail Road into Southampton County in the State of North Carolina to a stake and pin, crossing with the line of the grant of the said Joseph M. S. Rogers, thence N 23 3/4 degrees W. 16 chains and 118 links to a shingle oak blazed and marked standing on the Bank of Meherim River, thence in the same course 20 links to low water mark of said River, thence down said River following its natural course to the place of beginning (excepting six and a half acres conveyed by deed from the said Herman L. Brantley to John Whitehead which is mentioned and described in said deed of record in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County) being the tract of land (excepting the said eight acres) which was also conveyed to the said Herman L. Brantley by deed from James Johnson and others as aforesaid and of record as aforesaid; also the following personal property, four Mules, two Horses, five hundred pounds of Corn, twenty stacks of fodder, two stacks of oats, ten quarts of Oxen, four head of Cattle,
