Drachman party of the second part, all of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia, witnesses, that in consideration of the sum of five thousand dollars (three thousand to be paid in cash & two thousand in the first day of March one thousand eight hundred and fifty nine) paid to the party of the first part, the receipt of which he hereby acknowledges, he the said Thos. H. Argubaut does give, grant, bargain, sell & convey unto the said Joseph H. Drachman of his heirs forever with general warranty, the tract of land in the County & State above named upon which the above named Thos. H. Argubaut now resides containing nine hundred & forty acres for land taxes of which see deed from Williams & others to Argubaut & Simmons Exr. to Argubaut. This said Thos. H. Argubaut covenants that he has the right to convey the said land to the grantee that he has done no act to encumber said land, that the grantee shall have quiet possession of said land free from all encumbrances & that he the said party of the first part will execute such further assurances of the said land as may be requisite.
