This Indenture, made this 31st day of March, in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight, between Thomas Drury and Pamelia Drury his both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Henry Drake of the same County & State of the other part, Witnesseth, that the said Thomas Drury and Pamelia his wife for and in consideration of the sum of \$196.10^{cts} to them in hand paid by the said Henry Drake the receipt whereof the said Thomas Drury & Pamelia his wife doth acknowledge themselves fully and amply satisfied, and paid doth grant bargain and sell by these presents unto the said Henry Drake his heirs assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land and premises, situate, lying and being in the County and State aforesaid containing by a late survey ninety seven Acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to-wit: Beginning at a small Red Oak at a path a line of Henry Drake Thomas Drury & James G. Jones, thence along the path N. 70. E. 38 pole to a small Pine a Cr. of Thomas Drury, thence N. 16. W. 37 pole to the road leading to the Duck Creek Swamp meeting those, thence thence along the road N. 31 E. 77 pole to a Cr. of W. Ellis Ealey's Land where we turn from the Road, thence S. 73 E. 91 1/2 pole to a sweet gum allomed of W. Ellis Ealey. Thence S. 15 W. 136 pole to a Red Oak at Variation of Ealey's line, thence S. 19 W. 40 pole to a pine variation in the line, thence due S. 16 pole to a Maple abn. of W. Ellis Ealey & John C. Johnson, thence N. 86 W. 114 pole to a small sweet gum in John C. Johnson's line, thence N. 20 E. 32 pole to a Red Oak a Cr. of James G. Jones & Henry Drake, thence N. 75 W. 41 1/2 pole to a Dead Pine in James G. Jones line near his Littlefield thence N. 31 W. 44 pole to the
