This Deed made this 25th day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight between W^m E. Myrick and James Barnes Executor of Jacob Barnes deceased of the one part and James E. Drake and wife Susan of the other part; Witnesseth; that the said James E. Drake did by a deed of trust admitted to record in the Clerk's office of the County Court of Southampton County on the second day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty five convey to William E. Myrick trustee, two tracts of land of land that is to say the tract on which the said Drake now resides on one half and bounded by the lands of Bennett Banett, Benjamin F. Banett's heirs, William Drake and others; and another tract known as the Dick place, lying near the Pine Grove supposed to contain one hundred and one acres more or less and bounded by the lands of W^m F. Banett, Benjamin Small the heirs of Lewis Small Junior deceased (formerly by Jonathan Darnall who married his widow) and others. Albeit said two tracts of land was conveyed as aforesaid together with other property to the said James Barnes for the payment of a debt of about two hundred and one dollars due to Jacob Barnes and another debt of about one hundred and twenty six dollars due to B. E. & M. D. Doyle; which said latter debt has been assigned to the said Jacob Barnes. Now this deed with the fact that the said James E. Drake hath fully paid and satisfied the whole of the said debts to the said James Barnes & given as aforesaid and hath fully discharged himself from all obligations of every kind in any manner created by the said deed of trust and the said W^m E. Myrick (trustee) and the said James Barnes do hereby release the said James Drake from all claims in the premises, and do recovery and require to him the said two tracts of land and all other property in the said deed of trust mentioned.
