This Deed made this 5th day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight between W^m E. Myrick and James Barnes Executrix of Jacob Barnes deceased after my part and James Drake and wife Susan of the other part, witnesseth, that the said James E. Drake did by a deed of trust agree to record in the Clerk's office of the County Court of Southampton County on the second day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty five convey to William E. Myrick, trustee, two tracts of land aforesaid that is to say the tract on which the said Drake now resides more or less bounded by the lands of Bennett Bennett, Benjamin F. Bennett his heirs, William Drake and others; and another tract known as the "Vick place", lying near the Penny Grove supposed to contain one hundred and one acres more or less bounded by the lands of W^m T. Bennett, Benjamin C. Quill the heirs of Lewis C. Quill Senior deceased (now held by Jonathan D. Doudent who manages his widow) and others. Which said two tracts of land were conveyed as aforesaid together with other property to the sum the sum of a debt of about two hundred and one dollars due to Jacob Barnes and another debt of about one hundred and twenty six dollars due to R. D. & H. D. Goff; which said latter debt has been assigned to the said Jacob Barnes. I now this deed witnesseth that the said James E. Drake hath fully paid and satisfied the whole of the said debts to the said James Barnes & executors as aforesaid and hath fully discharged himself from all obligations of any kind in any manner created by the said deed aforesaid and the said W^m E. Myrick trustee and the said James Barnes do hereby release the said James Drake from all claims in the premises, and do recover and retain the said two tracts of land and all other property in the said deed of trust mentioned.
