And whereas the said lands have been fully paid and the said William Prince desires the said property to be released to him. Now therefore this deed witnesseth that the said William S. Goodwyn in consideration of the premises unity and with the consent of the said Sam'l. Drury, James Drury, David Prince and Joel Prince testifieth by this becoming parties to this deed and beginning now sealing the same, doth grant and release unto the said William Prince all the property consisting of land and negroes, hereinbefore mentioned and referred to or conveyed and more particularly described in the aforesaid deed of trust bearing date the 16<sup>th</sup> May 1853. The said Sam'l. Drury, James Drury, David Prince, and Joel Prince release unto the said William Prince all their claims upon the said property without the following signatures and seals.

Woodard of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, during her life and at her death to my Brothers John R. Woodard and Nathan S. Woodard and to my sisters Eliza A. Woodard, Martha A. Woodard and Aunt W. J. Pope any of Rosignan J. Pope to them and their heirs forever.
