Drury, James Drury, David Prince and Joel Prince despatchably this bearing parties to this does and beginning and sealing the same, doth grant and release unto the said William Prince all the property consisting of land and negroes, heretofore mentioned and referred to in conveyances and more particularly described in the aforesaid deed of trust bearing date the 26th May 1853.
