

the aggregate to three thousand two hundred and fifty dollars and one against 60<sup>th</sup> Oct  
for one hundred and twenty dollars. Now whereas it has been agreed between the  
said Richard Elbridge and Rebbeck A. Turner that the above mentioned slaves and  
their future issues, their heirs and profits and the abovesigned bonds and ac-  
cruing interest shall after her death be contemplated inhumanely be held and  
enjoyed by Rebbeck Rebbeck A. Turner during the continuance of her sole and  
separate use and benefit free from the control of her said intended husband  
and to be in no wise subject to his control or debt more over which he may  
hereafter contract and it is further agreed that the said property & bonds  
shall be at the sole and only disposal by will or otherwise of the said  
Rebbeck notwithstanding her continuance. And it is further agreed that in case  
the said Rebbeck should survive her intended husband, the said R. F. Elbridge.  
She should not have or claim any part of the real or personal estate whereof  
the said Richard F. Elbridge shall be seized or possessed or entitled to at  
any time during the continuance between them by virtue of law or otherwise  
Now this Undersigned Witnesseth, that in pursuance of the before recited agree-  
ment and in consideration of the sum of five dollars to the said Rebbeck  
paid by the said Richard Elbridge, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged  
she the said Rebbeck A. Turner by and with the privy consent of agreement  
of the said Richard F. Elbridge testified by his being a party to and signing of  
sealed this agreement hath granted and conveyed unto the said Richard  
Elbridge his heirs and assigns the said negro slaves and bonds before mentioned  
in this deed. To have & to hold the said property & bonds hereby conveyed  
to him and his heirs forever. Upon trust notwithstanding that the said trustee  
shall permit the said Rebbeck to hold, have, receive and enjoy the use profits  
hers and interest of the said slaves & bonds during the said continuance for her  
sole & separate use and benefit, and after the said continuance, if she survives  
her intended husband to have & to hold the same absolutely, and if she die  
before him then the said trustee shall make over the said property to such  
person or persons and in such manner & proportions as the said Rebbeck A.  
Turner shall by will or otherwise direct and shall dispose after her property  
during the continuance of the said Rebbeck shall so direct by any writing  
property withheld by two or more witnesses.
