This Deed made this 27<sup>th</sup> day of December 1855, between John M. Gurley & Josiah Joyner (of Sulphur). Whereas the said Josiah Joyner being indebted to the said Gurley the sum of two hundred & four dollars & 34 cents, did on the 31<sup>st</sup> of October 1847, execute a deed conveying a tract of land & certain other property to W. B. Shands in trust to secure the payment of the said debt. And on 5<sup>th</sup> day of August 1850 the said Joyner being indebted to the said Gurley in another sum of Eighty two dollars & 31 cents did execute another deed conveying certain property to W. B. Shands in trust to secure the payment of the said debt. And on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of August 1854 the said Josiah Joyner being indebted to the said Gurley in the further sum one hundred and eighty three & twenty three cents, did convey by deed to Samuel Kello certain property and also the tract mentioned in trust to secure the payment of said debt, all of which deeds are on file in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County, - the first committed to record on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1847, the second on the 10<sup>th</sup> of August 1850 & the third on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of September 1854. And whereas the said Josiah Joyner has fully paid off & discharged the debts secured or intended to be secured by the several deeds aforesaid which the said John M. Gurley hereby acknowledges - he the said John M. Gurley hereby releases & recovers all the estate right, title & interest both legal and equitable which he has or can claim under the deeds herein above referred to to the property and said Deeds conveyed or any part thereof to the said Josiah Joyner his heirs Executors administrators & assigns forever.
