Gillette, his wife, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, of the one part, and Benjamin C. McNeill of the same County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Robert S. Barnes and Matilda his wife, and Joseph C. Gillette and Edith C. his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty four Hundred and sixty three 33 1/2 Dollars (2463 33 1/2) to them in hand paid by the said Benjamin C. McNeill at or before the making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged Have granted bargain and sold and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto him the said Benjamin C. McNeill his heirs and assigns forever, all their rights titles and interests in and to the tract or parcel of land and premises of which Lewis McNeill died seignior, and which he bequeathed to the said Matilda Barnes, Edith C. Gillette and Benjamin C. McNeill by his last Will and Testament: the said tract or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and parish of Saint Lukes containing by estimation Seven hundred and thirty nine acres to the same more or less and bounded by the lands of James M.
