

This Deed this Good day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty nine, between James W. Parker, grantor of the first part, and John Robert Parker, grantor of the first part, do hereby acknowledge, that the said grantor for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand and set hundred dollars (\$1000.00 each) to the said grantor by the said grantor paid, the receipt of which sum is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant unto the said John Robert Parker all that tract of land on which the said James W. Parker now resides supposed to contain three hundred and forty acres more or less and bounded as follows to-wit: Beginning at a Pine tree on the South side of the road leading from Jerusalem to the Cross Keys, about one hundred and fifty yards from the intersection of the path to Reddy's Mill, thence along said road to Thomas's Swamp, near Benjamin W. Correll's fence; thence along the various meanders of said Swamp to an Ash tree a corner in Thomas Reddy's line; thence along said Reddy's line to a Red Oak tree a corner for George W. Pickett; and the premises hereby conveyed; thence by a line of marked trees and a line here to an old Oak Swamp near the Mill path, a corner in Harrison P. Poff's line thence along the said Poff's line to a cypress tree on the hill; thence by a line of marked trees on said line to the beginning - But one fourth of an acre for the grave yard, excepted. And the said James W. Parker, covenants that he will warrant generally the property hereby conveyed. Witness the following Signature and Seal.

This Deed was this Good day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty nine, between John J. Kinross of the first part and James W. Parker of the other part, do hereby acknowledge, that the said Kinross for and in consideration of the sum of Eight hundred and fifty dollars (\$850.00 each) of the said Parker to the said Kinross paid, the receipt of which sum is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant unto the said Parker all that lot or parcel of land conveyed to the said Kinross during the last year by deeds from James Fagan and William Rivers supposed to contain four acres more or less the place and excepted as in deed from Fagan to Kinross, which said lot lies in the Village of Jerusalem and is bounded on the East by the easement of which separates the said lot from the lot of Richard J. Darden in a straight line from the Main Street in said Village to the Bottom of Snow; on the East by said Main Street; on the South by a large street which separates the said lot from the lands belonging to the estate of James Nicholl, deceased; and on the West by the said River together with all the buildings and privileges in any manner attached to said lot.
