

This Deed made this 4th day of July 1857, between William B. Shands of the one part, and Sarah A. Ramsay of the other, witnesseth, that whereas by a decree of the County Court of Southampton made at the November Term 1857, Wm. B. Shands was appointed a special Commissioner to sell a tract of land lying in Southampton County belonging to Lucy Ramsay's heirs, and a plan containing 282 acres, and whereas the said Wm. B. Shands by virtue of the said decree did on the 15th of December 1857 sell the said tract of land receiving the full and all the purchase money due and payable on the same, and whereas the said Sarah A. Ramsay being the purchaser, and whereas the said Sarah A. Ramsay has paid all the purchase money now therefore in consideration of the premises the said William B. Shands doth grant unto the said Sarah A. Ramsay a tract of land lying in Southampton County containing 183 acres, it being a tract of land formerly owned by Jacob Ramsay. And the said William B. Shands doth warrant and defend unto the said Sarah A. Ramsay the title, vested in her by the decree of the November Term 1857, of the County Court and no other as witnesseth the following signatures and seal.

Trustee, the following property, to wit: One tract of land situated in the County of
Southampton on which said Bradshaw now resides, one Horse, one buggy,
Household and Kitchen furniture, farming utensils, and Stock of Cattle, Sheep &
hogs - Interest to Seven Dollars Kicks in the following named debts - the execution
issued from the Clerk's office of Southampton County at New Bern 1854 for
the sum of Twenty one Dollars and five cents and also the sum of six dollars
and Eighty one cents costs with Int. thereon from the 23rd of March 1854, also
one bond for Twenty three Dollars due the 18th of July 1854, also one bond due
25th of Jan'y 1859, for eighteen Dollars, ~~and~~ twenty five cents, also one bond due the
53rd day of Jan'y 1859, for thirty five Dollars and two cents, also one bond due
the 13th of Jan'y 1859 for twenty three dollars and twenty cents, also the sum of
One Hundred and fifty Dollars for unsold & unsold material between us.
