This Indenture made this 11th day of _____ in the year 1859, between Lewis C. Mason
of the County of Stoughton and State of Va of the one part and Sterling Edge of
the same County & State of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Lewis C. Mason
for and in consideration of the sum of Twelve hundred dollars (\$1200.00) good and lawful
money of the United States to him in hand paid by the said Sterling Edge at or before
the signing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof he does hereby acknowledge
and therefore acquit and forever discharge the said Sterling Edge, his heirs &
assigns (and Administrators by these presents, his joint, several, sole, altered, or
several releases and confinements by these presents does grant, bargain, sell, alien,
convey, release, and confirm unto the said Sterling Edge and his heirs and assigns
in general a certain tract of Land Situate lying and being in the County of Stoughton
in the State of Va and containing 340 acres by a recent Survey bounded
as follows to wit; Beginning at the Bridge over Mill Swamp, thence South
along the County road to larger Bridge of Williamsens Bridges over the
three Creeks; thence easterly along the Main run of the three Creeks as it meanders
to a point near the junction of the Mill Swamp & three Creeks; thence North to
the Swamp; thence westerly along the Mill Swamp as it meanders to the same
place together with all the state, title, interest and property claim and demand
whatsoever of him the said Lewis C. Mason in Law or Equity or other wise howsoever
of, in, to or out of the same. To have and hold the said tract of Land and every part and
parcel thereof with their appurtenances unto the said Sterling Edge his heirs and
assigns forever and unto the heirs, executors and assigns of him the said Sterling
Edge his heirs and assigns forever.

And the said Lewis C. Mason for himself, his heirs, executors and administrators doth
covenant, promise, grant and agree to and with the said Sterling Edge his heirs and
assigns by these presents in manner and form following, to wit; That he the said Lewis
C. Mason and his heirs the said tract or parcel of Land and premises hereby granted
is intended to take with the appurtenances unto the said Sterling Edge his heirs
and assigns against him the said Lewis C. Mason and his heirs, executors
and assigns or person or persons who or who will warrant and defend by and
by these presents.

And Witnesseth whereof he has hereunto set his hand and seal this 11th day
of February 1859.
