


This Indenture made this Sixth day of May 1858, between James W. Murphy, Execut. of Simon Murphy deceased after and Jacob Lenoir of the other part, witness; that the party of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand and fifty one dollars and 86/4 to him in hand paid by the said Jacob Lenoir, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged has granted bargained and sold, and does hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Jacob Lenoir his heirs and assigns forever with special warranty the following property, to wit; that certain tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Southampton, lot pursuant to the will of Simon Murphy containing Two hundred and thirty and a half acres subject however to a right of way for Carriages over same from Franklin Depot towards Monroe being the land referred to in the bill and proceedings of a chancery suit in the Circuit Court of Southampton County under the style of "Murphy's Execut. vs. Lenoir" on the same Land a plat and Survey of which is filed as Exhibit B. in said suit with the exception of three acres of said Land carried by the public road leading to South Bay, which is not intended to be hereby conveyed.



Mighart, of the first part, and Robert Marvel of the second part, witness that the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, have granted, bargained, and sold and do by these presents grant, bargain and sell unto the said party of the second part at certain tract of land situated in the County of Southampton containing three hundred acres
