By Virtue of a Decree pronounced by the Circuit Court of the County of Southampton
 and State of Virginia directing the sale of the real estate of Giles S. Whitney
 dec'd. by the undersigned as Commissioner and whereas in obedience to said decree said real
 estate was sold and at said sale Ludlow Lawrence, Willie Bradshaw and
 Alfred S. Stephenson became the purchasers of the undivided interest of the said
 Giles S. Whitney in a certain tract of Land and mill thereon and whereas by
 a further decree of said Court made at the May Term 1859 directing as to
 collect said purchase money and execute deeds for said real estate and whereas
 the purchase money for said Land and mill has been collected and said
 Willie Bradshaw and Alfred S. Stephenson having relinquished their interest
 in said purchase to Alfred Stephenson. Therefore this Deed made this 1st day
 of June One thousand eight hundred and fifty nine, between Elijah J. Williams
 and Elliott L. Fry Seniors of the one part and Ludlow Lawrence of the
 other part. Witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of five hundred and
 ninety Dollars the said Elijah J. Williams and Elliott L. Fry Seniors
 do grant unto the said Ludlow Lawrence all the interest of the said
 dec'd. in one mill and tract of land in which said mill is situated lying in
 said County and State and bounded by the Lands of James or Lewis and
 the old Whitney tract, lands of the poor house and William M. Henson and
 the mill pond, the right whereof as aforesaid by said Decree as aforesaid
