

This Deed made the 20th day of June in the year 1859, between James Butler and his wife, of the one part and Patrick Rose, the trustee, of the other part do hereby certify that the said James Butler and Martha, his wife, doth grant unto the said Patrick Rose, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns against all persons who shall lawfully warrant and forever defend a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton containing two hundred and eight acres be the same more or less and bounded by the lands of James M. Cherry, Susan Joyner, & widow Jane Butler. And trust to draw George M. Gardant and Leonard Cobb my deacons to Harris and Dose in the sum of one thousand nine hundred and 94 cents to be by a bond bearing date the 20th day of June 1859.
