

This deed made this 16th day of July, one thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty nine, between Richard B. Davis, of the one part, Franklin Vick (Trustee) of the other part, witness that the said Richard B. Davis doth grant unto the said Franklin Vick the following property, to wit; One tract of land it being the same in which I now reside containing by estimation one hundred sixty acres more or less bounded by the land of Mrs. Abner, Coleman Abner, Benjamin Davis & others together with the following chattle property, Two beds & furniture, one Double gun, Two Tables, Cane, one Straw, Ten head of Sheep, four head of hogs & one pair of Oxen & D. Benthall in a certain note of One hundred & Eighteen Dollars and Twenty eight cents due the 16th day of July 1859. The Conditions of the above trust are as follows, viz: Should the aforesaid R. B. Davis pay the above named note in full on application, then this trust to be null & void, otherwise the aforesaid Franklin Vick after giving ten Days notice will proceed to sell the same at public Auction for cash or enough thereof to satisfy said note & charges.
