This Indenture made and entered into this fifteenth day of September One thousand eight hundred and fifty nine, between Richard Johnson of Southampton County Virginia of the first part, Abram Riddick of the second part (and J. J. Daughton of the third part, both of Bedford County North Carolina be it remembered that said Richard Johnson is jointly and jointly to the said Abram Riddick as follows first by indenture made on a note paid to him of one hundred dollars dated January 1st 1858 5th part was made to me by my sister Eliza Johnson two days after date. Second, my note to said Riddick dated March 1. 1859 for twenty five dollars & lastly my note to said Riddick dated Sept. 1st 1859 for forty eight dollars & six & nine cents which doth the said Richard Johnson is willing and desirous to save himself and free from damage by reason of their conveyance by ships. Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by J. J. Daughton Trustee, the receipt whereof the said Richard Johnson do acknowledge, the said Johnson hath given, granted, bargained and sold unto him the said J. J. Daughton Trustee the following property viz: One small house, one cow, wheels & gear, two plows, three riding horses, one set of chairs, Spade, manure fork, 3 beds, stoves, 4 furniture, all my furniture & working tools, all my crop of Corn, Paddy, Cotton &c. raised the year 1859 in the County of Southampton, State of Virginia. To have and to hold all the aforesaid property unto the said J. J. Daughton Trustee and his heirs forever. Upon trust nevertheless that the said Johnson is to remain in possession of all the aforesaid property until required by the said Riddick to be sold. When said the said Daughton Trustee shall after advertising for ten days sell for cash or otherwise as may be agreed on all the aforesaid property herein conveyed and
