Knudsen and C. Antimetta his wife, do grant unto the said William H. Butler that lot and office owned by them and lately occupied by the said John J. Knudsen as a law office and besides as follows to wit, with North by the hotel property owned by John Warham, the West side of the office together with the building on the same side being on the dividing line east by the line of building which is the dividing line between the said office lot and the property lately owned by Dr. J. Mahan's estate, on the South by the lot owned by George Selzer and on the West by the Main Street leading through Jerusalem. And the said grantors doth warrant generally the property here conveyed.
