This deed made this 2nd of December 1859, between Henry Howell of the
 one part and John R. Daugherty of the other Whitefield that the said Henry
 Howell for and in consideration of the sum of twelve hundred and ten dollars
 to him paid by the said John R. Daugherty at and before the sealing of these
 presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, both grant unto the said
 John R. Daugherty a certain tract of land lying in the County of Southampton
 known as the Edwards tract containing by estimation four hundred and thirty
 acres and bounded on the north by the lands of Benjamin Council east by
 those of Jordan Edwards, south by those of James Sillman (now west by
 those of William Hicks and John Moore and which was decided by Nathan
 M. Howell to Henry Howell and the said Henry Howell warrants granting
 the title of the said tract of land to the said John R. Daugherty.

 of Middleport, in the County of Niagara and State of New York of the
 second part.
 Witnesseth, that the said George W. Decker of the first part with the

 Decker in and to his interest in the property known as the "Holloway Mill" and
 the lands bought of J. H. Hill and Co. District containing (A. D.) four
 acres more or less, all the buildings and improvements situated thereon the
 said James Edgar with his Council and a Justice of the Peace, which is

 Witnesses, duly sworn and named, me there, and none else used in making
