

one toward Mill; all the machinery and fixtures belonging to the mill except the one
 running under law used for manufacturing Rail Road & other power and bridge
 and Manufacturing timber on hand; and also the sum of Twenty thousand Dollars,
 in which amount the said Edmund Hobbey and Salmon Brickford have ex-
 pended five notes, each for the sum of 4000. The thousand Dollars being, even
 and this instrument not bearing interest from the first day of June proximo,
 payable in one, two, three, four, and five years.

And whereas the said Edmund Hobbey and Salmon Brickford have
 purchased the property hereinbefore described with the view of Manufacturing
 Shingles and other timber and are desirous of paying the above named notes to-
 ward maturity; they the said Edmund Hobbey and Salmon Brickford herein-
 agree that one half of all the money arising from the sales of Shingles
 and timber of every description manufactured at the said Mill shall be
 paid to the said George W. Peck, who shall credit the amount on the notes of
 the said Edmund Hobbey and Salmon Brickford until every one of the
 said notes are fully paid, &c.

The Agreement further witnesseth that the said Edmund Hobbey and Salmon
 Brickford may deliver unto the said George W. Peck in the City of Portland,
 and before the expiration of the period of years (100,000) One hundred thousand
 feet board measure of spruce another kind (10) five feet of an inch thick
 up (and 1) eight inches in width, to be of prime quality, at (20) Twenty five
 dollars per thousand feet board measure the said Peck to charge the same with
 (3) Three dollars per thousand feet, board measure, and credit the balance on the notes
 of the said Hobbey and Brickford in like manner (and also the said Hobbey and
 Brickford may deliver unto the said Peck in Portland (100,000) one hundred thousand
 feet board measure of (2) 4) Two by four inch Spruce at (15) Fifteen
 feet length of prime quality at (20) Twenty dollars per thousand feet board
 measure, to be charged (and credited in like manner; further the said Hobbey
 and Brickford are permitted to deliver unto the said George W. Peck in
 Portland, on or before the expiration of two years from this date, a sufficient quan-
 tity of first quality Spruce Shingles (7) Seven inches wide (24) Twenty four inches
 long, sawed and planed as per sample and banded in packages of (500)
 Fifty each at (12 50) Twelve dollars and fifty cents per thousand delivered
 the said notes hereinbefore mentioned; yet the said Hobbey and Brickford may
 if they please consign any number of the above described Shingles to the said
 George W. Peck in Portland until their notes are paid, and the said Peck shall
 receive, send, ship, and sell them for the best price he can obtain in the
 City of Portland or elsewhere; one half of the proceeds of said sales to be cred-
 ited to the notes of the said Hobbey and Brickford and the other one half to be paid unto
 the said Hobbey and Brickford at their order; and the said Peck for the duties
 hereinbefore mentioned shall receive from the said Hobbey and Brickford the sum
 of (50) fifty cents per thousand feet all Shingles so received, graded &c.
 The Agreement further witnesseth that the said Hobbey and Brickford are desirous
 that the said mill, any of the property or machinery now pertaining to the same, so that
 they may hereafter place there without the consent of the said George W. Peck;
 and that they the said Hobbey and Brickford shall have the property insured for
 the sum of (3000) Three thousand Dollars, all of which amount in case
 of its destruction shall be paid to George W. Peck for credits on
 the notes before mentioned or be wholly and jointly employed in
