that in consideration of the sum of thirteen hundred and forty one \$134 dollars and
paid by the said B. F. Bell in consideration of which the said Alexander
Garrison and Martha, his wife, doth sell to the said Benj. F. Bell the following
Tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton near Courtland
and bounded as follows, Beginning at a corner of Pensalsow Road or Gece-
tors road at Thivens old Store, thence up said road to a pine tree to branch
to a pine a corner on a path leading thence up said branch to another pine
tree said Railroad to a pine at corner on Main Street then to said Oak Avenue
