This Indenture made in the 16th day of February 1860, between Augustus Bessley
of the County of Giles and the State of North Carolina, on the first part and
William Henry Lee and Quenton Brady on the second part of the County of
Giles and State of North Carolina, Witnesseth, that whereas the said Augustus
Bessley is justly indebted to the said William Henry Lee and Quenton Brady in the
following sums: To William Henry Lee, one note bearing date with these
premises for the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars and to Quenton
Brady one note for two hundred and fifty dollars bearing date January
3rd eight hundred and fifty, and whereas the said Augustus Bessley is
willing to secure the payment of said debts. Now therefore this Indenture
witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises together with the
further consideration of the sum of one dollar to the said Augustus Bessley
in hand paid by the said William Henry Lee and Quenton Brady, the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged in full, he the said Augustus Bessley,
hath granted, bargained, and sold (and by these presents doth grant bargain
and sell) unto the said William Henry Lee and Quenton Brady his life interest in a
tract of land lying and being in the County of Southampton and State of Vir-
ginia, on the waters of a Potomac river and bounded as follows, viz beginning at a
red oak near the Dorton Farm and running to a Spruce near the gate
of the aforementioned farm and from thence to the line of James Cobb near the road
said land is bounded by the land of James Cobb on the line of William
Johnston a mine, thence run to hole the said land and premises and all
and singular the tenements, hereditaments, woods, ways, waters, mines, minerals,
improvements, rents, issues, profits, revenues, privileges, and ap-
partenances thereto belonging in any wise appertaining to the said
