Henderson and all other children of his heretofore born.

Witnesseth that whereas James Wallace died by deed of trust made the 17th day of July 1859, and duly recorded in Santhampton County Court in the 18th of the same month and day to Jno. M. Gentry as Trustee in certain tract or parcel of land lying and being the County aforesaid situated more or less between a line by the line of John A. Phillips and the same formerly owned by him. Now the property of a Smith and brother of a Belfast containing four acres more or less interest to secure the payment of and executed to Jno. M.
