 Whereas John S. Crump late of Chesterfield County died by his last will
 and Testament desire and direct that his whole estate real and personal should be sold,
 and whereas the said Crump nominated no executor in his will and whereas
 the said Benjamin L. Lundie has qualified as administrator with the will
 annexed of the said Crump in the County Court of Chesterfield, where the
 said will has been duly admitted to record:— and by virtue of the said will
 the said Lundie has this day sold (and doth grant unto the said H. S. Pope
