

This Deed made this 16th day of January A.D. 1860, between Hanson S. Pope and Ben C. Pope of the one part and Joseph G. Crumpler of the other part, of the County of Smithampton and State of Virginia, Witnesseth, that whereas in the Deed of Bargain and Sale from the parties of the first part to the party of the second part conveying a certain piece or parcel of Land situate, lying and being in the County of Smithampton, it being a part of the "Brown" tract of Land as bought by the said Pope and containing two hundred and five and a half acres to the same more or less as will be seen by reference to the said Deed dated the 13th day of November 1857 and recorded in the Clerk's office of Smithampton County Court this 6th day of November 1857, the said party of the first part reserved to themselves forever all the cypress trees eighteen inches and upwards in diameter at the stump all the pine trees and logs fifteen inches and upwards in diameter at the stump and all the poplar trees fifteen inches and upwards in diameter at the stump and whereas it was their intention to reserve the same to themselves only for the period of two years from the date of the said Deed of Bargain and Sale dated the 13th day of November 1857 and whereas two years (and upwards) have elapsed since the date of the said Deed the time for which the said timber was to be reserved to the parties of the first part. Now therefore this Deed witnesseth that the said Hanson S. Pope and Ben C. Pope do grant unto the said Joseph G. Crumpler all right, title, and interest and claim that they have to the timber as aforesaid reserved to them on the tract or parcel of Land conveyed by them to the said Crumpler by the said Deed of Bargain and Sale dated the 13th November 1857, with general warranty.

This Deed made this the 21st day of January 1860, between Joseph G. Crumpler of the one part and Augustus Crumpler of the other part, all of the County of Smithampton and State of Virginia, Witnesseth, that the said Joseph G. Crumpler for and in consideration of the sum of Fourteen hundred Dollars to him in hand paid by the said Augustus Crumpler at or before the making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained and sold to the said Augustus Crumpler his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land situate, lying and being in the County aforesaid, it being a part of the Brown tract of Land and the same purchased by the said Joseph G. Crumpler from B. C. & H. S. Pope as shown by Deed bearing date on the 13th day of November 1857, and bounded as therein mentioned by the lands of B. C. & H. S. Pope, Edward C. Crumpler and others containing two hundred and five and a half acres (more or less) with general warranty.
