This deed of Trust made this 21st of May 1860, between John C. Applwhite the grantor of the first part and Benjamin F. Applwhite the trustee of the second part and Benjamin Applwhite of the third part, Whitefield, that the said John C. Applwhite doth grant unto the said Benj. F. Applwhite all his growing crops of Corn, fodder, shucks, cotton, peas, Apples to make bread now growing this year. In trust to secure Benjamin Applwhite as trustee to three bonds set afloat for amount of \$1000. One James Dwyer second bond for amount of \$900 due to Wm. R. Shands and Wm. Goodwyn commissaries, third bond due Wm. R. Shands and Wm. Goodwyn for \$1000 and the said bonds are to be paid in the order in which they are named, first Dwyer's bond, next the bonds due the said Shands and Goodwyn in the order in which they are
