

This Deed made this 22<sup>d</sup> day of May 1860, between E. W. Maफन्ड्रिंग aforesaid Commissioner acting under warrant of the Circuit Court for the County of Southampton rendered in the cause of Barnes ad vs. Barnes ye at the November Term 1859 after the same had been heard by Abram Riddick of the aforesaid Wimpeyfield, that whereas E. W. Maफन्ड्रिंग doth grant unto the said Abram Riddick all that tract of land known as the Howell old place adjoining the lands lately occupied by Elizabeth Johnson and containing about one hundred & twenty acres it being the same land conveyed by A. Weston et al to Geo. Moore as Trustee for Anna Howell by Deed dated June 30<sup>th</sup> 1849, And the E. W. Maफन्ड्रिंग conveys the title specially.

This Deed made this 22<sup>d</sup> day of May in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty, between John J. Kindred of the first part and J. Mass. deu Smith and William H. Smith of the other part, Wimpeyfield, that whereas Henry Blow of the County of Southampton, did, on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of October in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty seven, execute a deed of trust to the said Kindred conveying a certain tract of land in the said deed especially described by metes and bounds which said deed of trust was admitted to record on the said 27<sup>th</sup> day of October anno Domini 1857, in the Clerk's office of the County Court of said County to secure SamuelHello as security for the said Henry Blow. And whereas the said Kindred as trustee in said deed of trust was required to sell the said tract of Land, provided to do so at public auction on the 2<sup>d</sup> day of January in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty nine, on the premises having previously advertised the same according to law &c. And the said J. M. Smith and Wm. H. Smith became the purchasers for the sum of fifteen hundred dollars. Now this Deed witnesseth that the said Kindred having received from the said purchasers the said sum in full, for and in consideration of the premises, doth grant and convey unto the said purchasers to be held and owned by them jointly and equally all that tract or parcel of land in the said deed of trust mentioned and therein described as follows, to-wit - well that tract or parcel of land on which the said granted Henry Blow now resides containing three hundred and eighty five acres more or less (385 acres) and bounded north by the lands of Thomas Riddick - East by the Notchway river - South by those of Charles Wick, Robt. Wick and John M. Gentry - and west by those of Stith H. Webster and known generally as "the old Blow place".

And the said Kindred further as of aforesaid convey all of such right, title and interest in and to the said land as may be vested in him and
