Now this Release made the 25th day of June 1860, between the said John M. Holland of the one part and the said James A. Bell of the other part, Witnessed; that the said John M. Holland in consideration of the premises aforesaid doth release unto the said Jas. A. Bell and his heirs and assigns forever, the land aforesaid, with all its appurtenances. This Deed made the 25th day of June one thousand eight hundred and sixty between James A. Bell and Emeline C., his wife, of the one part and Jacob Lenoir of the other part, all the parties residing in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnessed, that the said James A. Bell and Emeline C., his wife in consideration of the sum of six thousand dollars do grant with general warranty unto the said Jacob Lenoir and his heirs and assigns forever the following real estate, to wit the Village of Franklin in Southampton County, Town, a lot or parcel of land bounded south by the Seaboard and Roanoke Rail road, West by Richard Bantle's line, North by the lot lately owned by Wm. Munroe & by the Store house lot of A. W. Norfolk and East by the said Store house lot & the road or street (now the line of the said Rail road) and running westwardly along said Rail road line three hundred and twelve feet to Richard Bantle's land, then northwardly along said Bantle's line one hundred and fifty five feet to a lot recently owned by Wm. T. Munroe, then eastwardly along the last named lot two hundred and twenty eight feet to A. W. Norfolk's Store lot, then Southwardly along the said Store lot seventy six feet then Eastwardly along the said Store lot eighty four feet to the said road or street, then Southwardly along the said road a Street seventy six feet to the first station. and is the same parcel of land with the improvements purchased by the said James A. Bell of John M. Holland & wife by Deed dated the 23^d day of December 1858, in which Deed, a lien was retained, which has this day been released.
