This Deed made this 9th day of September in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty eight, between Augustus Smith of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, and Lawson Beale of the same County and State of the other part, Witnesses, that the said Augustus Smith for and in consideration of the sum of eighty five dollars and fifty cents to him in hand paid by the said Lawson Beale, at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant, bargain, and sell unto him the said Lawson Beale, his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of Saint Luke's, containing by a late Survey twenty eight and half acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows. Beginning at a post oak near the road at corner for Nathan Thomas and for said Lawson Beale, thence along said Lawson Beale's line N 20° E 98 1/2 poles to a black gum standing in a small branch at corner in Charles Beale's line thence along an angle of marked trees S 17 1/2° E. 60 1/2 poles to a small post at new corner for said Augustus Smith and Charles Beale, thence S 9° W 51 1/4 poles to a maple at the path thence S 7 1/2° W 50 1/2 poles to a black gum at the run of a brick back horse Swamp at corner for said Lawson Beale, thence along his line of marked trees to the beginning. To have and to hold the above described tract or parcel of land and premises with the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining unto him the said Lawson Beale, his heirs and assigns forever to and for the only proper
