This deed made the 16th day of October in the year 1860, between Jacob
Blade of the one part and Alfred T. Stephenson of the other part, Witnesseth;
that the said Jacob Blade doth grant unto the said Alfred T. Stephenson
all his right, title and interest in the following property to wit: one tract or
parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia,
in which the said Jacob Blade now resides and bounded by the lands
of John Lewis, the land of Oliver Rinsford dec^d and lands of the Poor
House, also all his stock of hogs, cattle, sheep, crop of corn,
fodder, shucks, household and kitchen furniture, horse, plows carts,
and glass and all other property not abovementioned, in trust to
serve Robert M. Dolan in a bond for the sum of one hundred
and two dollars and 50/100 cents due the 30th day of October 1860, also all
other claims which may hereafter become due and owing to the Dolan
