Stephenson all his right, title and interest in the following property to wit, one tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, on which the said Jacob Blad now resides and bounded by the lands of John Lewis, the land of Oliver Ringford also and lands of the Poor House, also all his stock of hogs, cattle, sheep, crop of corn, fodder, shucks, house hold and kitchen furniture, horse, plows carts, and gear and all other property not aforesaid, in trust to seem, Robert M.
