This deed made this sixth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty, between Geo. D. Rockelle of the first part, and Geo. J. Kinross of the second part witnesses, that the said Rockelle did grant and convey to the said Kinross the following property, to wit: all that tract or parcel of land on which the said Rockelle now resides, containing one hundred and seventy five acres more or less lately purchased by him of Blawell C. Ferguson, also the entire interest of the said Rockelle in the tract of land on which John A. Brewster now resides, which said interest was granted and conveyed to said Rockelle by Thomas Bygum and wife by deed of record in this Southampton County, also the entire interest of said Rockelle in a tract of land lying at or near the "Piney Grove" which said tract was lately purchased of one Samuel Dandem by the said Rockelle and others.
