Goodwyn Commissioner, of the first part, and James Drury of Southampton County of the second part, Whereas the November Term of the former Court of Southampton County it was denied and ordered by the said Court in a certain cause then depending in the Chancery side of said Court between Samuel Drury and others complainants and all the Complainants' heirs and others defendants, that the said Goodwyn Commissioner appointed by the said Court, should make and execute to the said James Drury the purchaser of a certain tract of land in the proceedings mentioned, and described in said proceedings as the "Whitehead tract" a good and sufficient deed for the same with Special warranty. Now this Indenture, witnesseth, that the said William S. Goodwyn Commissioner as aforesaid in pursuance of said judicial order and in consideration of the premises, hath given, granted, bargained and sold and by this presents doth give, grant, bargain and sell unto the said James Drury the said tract of land in said proceedings mentioned, known as the "Whitehead tract" and more particularly described in said proceedings to which reference is hereby made.
